DR. NIGEL SHAUN MATTHEWS BDS, FDS, MBBS, FRCS, FRCS (OMFS)

Dr. Nigel Shaun Matthews joined the Indiana University School of Dentistry in 2020 as Clinical Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. He previously held the position of Director of Telehealth and Associate Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of North Carolina, Adams School of Dentistry. He completed his specialist training at Canniesburn Hospital in Glasgow, Scotland and developed a specific interest in both temporomandibular joint (TMJ) and facial deformity surgery.

Dr. Matthews is well-known for his expertise in the surgical management of TMJ pathology. In addition to editing the textbook entitled “Dislocation of the Temporomandibular Joint: A Guide to Diagnosis and Management”, Dr. Matthews has written several book chapters and over 40 peer reviewed articles on TMJ-related subjects. His lectureship commitments have included delivering international webinars, presentations and courses throughout Europe, North America, Australia, India, Brazil and the Caribbean. He is a Fellow of both the Royal College of Surgeons of England and Edinburgh, as well as a member of the American and European Society of TMJ Surgeons. His work on jaw joint replacement surgery has been extensively cited in several international journals and newspapers, as well as the BBC News.

In October 2016, Dr. Matthews was honored by the Barbados government with their Golden Jubilee Award in recognition of his service to the people of Barbados and the United Kingdom, through his work in medicine and surgery. In 2019, he was invited to be the Medical Honoree for the Arthritis Foundation of North Carolina, in acknowledgement of his clinical work treating children with juvenile idiopathic arthritis.

DON-JOHN SUMMERLIN, DMD, MS

Dr. Summerlin received his dental degree from the University of Alabama School of Dentistry and his specialty training in Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology from Indiana University School of Dentistry.

He is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology. He served on the faculty of Indiana University School of Dentistry for 20 years and the Indiana University School of Medicine Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine for another 13 years. Dr. Summerlin served as the president of the Fellowship Committee of the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology and as a site visitor for accreditation of Oral Pathology programs.

Dr. Summerlin has received numerous teaching awards over the years from both students and institutions, including the only dentist ever to be presented the teaching award for the Indiana University School of Medicine Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine. Dr. Summerlin has practiced diagnostic oral pathology for over 30 years and continues to do so at the Cutaneous and Maxillofacial Pathology Laboratory. In addition, he provides pathology services for the Head and Neck Tumor Clinic in association with the CENTA head and neck surgeons.
